#### This Christian Aid Week, will you help Amelia fight hunger?

Please help fund vital training and tools, so someone like Amelia can support their community to escape hunger. Amelia's story shows that hope drives transformative change.

For 80 years Christian Aid has mobilised thousands of churches, and every year, Christian Aid Week invites us all to put our hope into action. This Christian Aid Week, we each have 7 days to make a difference.

#### What will you do?


In Lenzie, during this week we are -

# Got a Will to Give?

We are privileged if we are in a position to leave a mark of our passing to be remembered by those people and causes we've cared for in life. A gift in your Will to the Church is one of the most valuable and lasting ways to continue your support of its ministry and mission.

Copies of the Church of Scotland's leaflet are available from the vestibule or online. A gift to your local church will encourage and sustain your own congregation's engagement with the communities it serves and can be a fixed monetary gift or a 'residual legacy' – what is left within your estate after all other bequests have been made.

As your Will is a legal document it is recommended that you have it drafted by someone who is legally qualified, but, even if yours is already in hand, the process to add a specific gift or legacy is simple and a quick word with your adviser will suffice.
