1st LENZIE COMPANY BOYS' BRIGADE



The 2025/26 session is well under way with 15 boys in Anchor Boys, 14 in Junior Section and 17 in Company Section, all meeting in the halls on a Friday evening.

Junior Section boys have played in a 7 a side football competition at the Toryglen Sports Centre against JS teams from other companies from Glasgow and surrounding areas. They played very well for the first time together and were delighted to win three matches, draw one and only lose two.

The BB/GB enrolment service was held on Sunday 26th October. We were able to parade from Lenzie Station to the church and return albeit without a band.

Company Section have entered two teams in the U.K. National Chess Competition and one in Masterteam. Our 'A' chess team (currently Scottish champions) were given a walkover in the first round and then defeated 268th Glasgow Company (Bishopbriggs) 6-1 in the second round. The 'B' team all playing for the first time unfortunately lost in the first round at 2nd Polmont. The Masterteam competition was very tough with some very difficult questions. Regrettably we were not in the top two that qualified from the first round staged at 1st Bearsden Company. Unfortunately, we are unable to defend our title of 5 a side under 15 football U.K. champions, as most of that team are now over age and there were not enough younger boys able to play.

Our joint outdoor activity weekend with the Girls' Brigade at the Abernethy Centre, Nethy Bridge unfortunately suffered at the hands of Storm Amy. We travelled as scheduled on the Friday evening without issues until we were 3 miles from the centre. After clearance of two trees and a lamppost blocking the road, we arrived an hour later than expected at the centre, only to find yet another tree blocking the entrance. Bags were carried up the driveway, to learn that the centre had within the last 10 minutes lost all power. As the electricity company did not expect power to be restored until the Monday, we had no alternative other than to return home on Saturday. Fortunately, the coach company were able to send a coach for us. Very graciously Abernethy Trust refunded our costs in full.

A few activities were available on the Saturday morning – archery, orienteering and the climbing wall. All other activities were not possible for safety reasons as they take place in forested areas.

As usual we will be delivering Christmas cards in Lenzie, Auchinloch and Woodilee only. The cost will be 40p per card, all proceeds going to charity. Latest drop off time is 1200 hrs on Friday 12th December. Collection boxes are in the vestibule of the New Hall and the Church. Please ensure that cards are fully and correctly addressed.

Climate Change is Happening. How Can Your Community Respond?

Climate change is impacting your homes and neighbourhoods, from storm damage in the winter, to overheating in the summer

Adaptation involves us preparing for both extreme weather such as storms floods, heatwaves droughts heavy snowfall, and more gradual changes such as when growing seasons start and end.

No matter what kind of community you are in, there are actions you can take to build resilience, prepare for climate change, and make your area healthier, safer, and more comfortable for people and wildlife.

A good place to start is preparing a pack in case severe storms cause a long-term power cut. Have enough candles and tinned foods to last up to 3 days. You can add other things to the pack as you wish like space blankets to keep warm and a power bank (rechargeable battery) to keep your phone working.



In February 2025 Boots launched their Blisterpack Recycling

scheme and the Boots in Sauchiehall street close to Waterstones has a collection box (pictured) for Blisterpacks. You can just put your empty Blisterpacks in the box or if you take in 5 packs and have a Boots Advantage card and the Recycle at Boots App you can get points on your card. The Boots in Lenzie and Kirkintilloch will be asked if they will take a box so local people don't have to travel into Glasgow to recycle their packs. You can also use the Recycle at Boots App with an Advantage card and make points recycling other items that can't be recycled at home. The Recycle at Boots app will help by validating your items or at advising if they are not eligible for a reward within 24h of logging. For more information go to
